Goal: Increase or maintain course completion
Vision 2023 Goal: Foster Student Success
Criteria: Increase the percentage of course completion by 1%
Threshold of Acceptability: Expected to be greater than the baseline and/or previous year's results, depending on which is greater

Percentage of Course Completion

The percentage of course completers is based on contact hours accounted at census date versus contact hours accounted at the end of semester.

Results:

Texas Southmost College (TSC) regularly tracks the percentage of course completion through the Office of Institutional Research. This data tracking originated from the TSC Strategic Plan – Vision 2026 Strategic Plan, and it continues to be part of the FY26 Strategic Priorities. Institutional data for this outcome was compiled from the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board (THECB), Data Resources for the Legislative Budget Board (LBB) Performance Measures (2019 – 2026) for Texas Community, Technical, and State Colleges. The most recent report for the LBB performance measures was published in March 2026; it contained data for the Fall 2024 cohort.

Overall, TSC has experience a low but steady completion of contact hours by the end of the semester ranging from 91.8% to 96.2%. The Fall-to-Fall Percent Change (target) is a comparison of the percent of completed contact hours between one Fall to the next. This target is achieved when there's an increase from the previous Fall. The target shows a positive trend in half of the nine years presented.
