



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

SOUTH TEXAS COLLEGE

and

TEXAS SOUTHMOST COLLEGE

This articulation agreement is designed to facilitate the transfer of students from Texas Southmost College (TSC) Associate of Applied Science Degree programs to South Texas College (STC) Bachelor Degree programs. Both institutions enter into this agreement under the following provisions:


1. This articulation is to facilitate the transfer of students after completing an Associate of Applied Science degree at Texas Southmost College to South Texas College in order to enable the student's progression to the next level of course work leading to a Baccalaureate degree.
2. All TSC courses completed in the Associate of Applied Science Degree are transferable to STC and will satisfy the indicated course requirements leading to the first two years of course work in the various STC Baccalaureate degree programs.
3. All course considered for transfer must be completed with a "C" or better for acceptance into any of STC's Baccalaureate degrees.
4. TSC students wishing to transfer must apply for admission with STC and meet all of STC's entrance requirements.
5. All students, including students intending to transfer from TSC, are strongly encouraged to work closely with the STC advisors prior to transferring to ensure timely completion of all Baccalaureate degree requirements. It is the responsibility of each student to be knowledgeable of all degree requirements and the provisions of this agreement.
6. The articulation agreement may be published and provided to TSC students as a transfer guide during academic advisement.
7. This articulation agreement will be reviewed annually by both institutions to ensure the ease of transfer of students from TSC to STC.
8. Change(s) to this agreement must be agreed upon by both parties.
