**Program Student Learning Outcomes**

Program Student Learning Outcomes (PSLO) are statements that specify what students will know, be able to do or be able to demonstrate when they have completed the program.

The program learning outcomes are consistent with the Texas Board of Nursing rule 215.9 and are as follows:

1. NCLEX-RN licensure exam pass rate will be at least eighty percent (80%) for the first-time test takers during the same 12-month period.
2. 95% of graduates will successfully complete the program within 150% time of the AND program.
3. 90% of graduates will successfully be employed within one year of graduation.
4. 90% of all semester four students will achieve the predictor benchmark of 900 on the HESI Exit Exam.

\*Grade of “C” or better is required for graduation.

†Students may take any course within this category of the TSC General Education Core Curriculum.

After graduation, the student must take the NCLEX-RN Exam in order to secure license to practice nursing.
