Students will learn the knowledge, skills, and abilities essential to provide basic care to residents of long-term care facilities. Topics include residents' rights, communication, safety, observation, reporting, and assisting residents in maintaining basic comfort and safety. The Nurse Assistant Training Program provides an intensive, 112-hour course consisting of classroom instruction, skills lab experience, and hands-on training as a clinical site. Upon completing the program, nursing assistants may find employment in nursing homes or other long-term care facilities under the supervision of a licensed or registered nurse. Upon successful completion of the program, students can take the Health and Human Services Commission certification exam to become a Certified Nursing Assistant.
